


When I Am in the Dip

WHAT DO YOU DO WHEN YOU'RE IN THE DIP?

"I will stand at my watch and station myself on the ramparts; I will look to see what he will say to me, and what answer I am to give to this complaint. Then the LORD replied: "Write down the revelation and make it plain on tablets so that a herald may run with it. For the revelation awaits an appointed time; it speaks of the end and will not prove false. Though it linger, wait for it; it will certainly come and will not delay." - Habakkuk 2:1-3

1) LISTEN

"I will stand at my watch and station myself on the ramparts; I will look to see what he will say to me..." - Habakkuk 2:1b

2) WRITE

"Then the LORD replied: "Write down the revelation and make it plain on tablets so that a herald may run with it." - Habakkuk 2:2

3) WAIT

"For the revelation awaits an appointed time; it speaks of the end and will not prove false. Though it linger, wait for it; it will certainly come and will not delay." - Habakkuk 2:3

THE FIVE WOES TO BABYLON:

Woe to him who piles up stolen goods... Hab 2:6

Woe to him who builds his realm by unjust gain... Hab 2:9

Woe to him who builds a city with bloodshed... Hab 2:12

Woe to him who gives drink to his neighbors... Hab 2:15

Woe to him who says to wood, 'Come to life!' Hab 2:19

THREE WORDS TO REMEMBER:

- BUT THE LORD

“But the LORD is in His holy temple; let all the earth be silent before Him.” - Habakkuk 2:20

Deeper Thoughts & Life Application:

- 1) Habakkuk didn't understand why God would use the wicked Babylonians to destroy his people. Is there something in your life you don't understand?
- 2) Habakkuk stopped to listen and write down the revelation. What is God saying to you?
- 3) One of the most quoted verses from Habakkuk is verse 2:4: “...but the righteous (or just) will live by faith.” What does this verse mean to you? (See also Romans 3:23-26.)
- 4) How has God used “a dip” to draw you closer to Him?
