

Jonah's Anger  
Jonah 4:1-10  
On the Run Week 4

*"Forty more days and Nineveh will be overturned. The Ninevites believed God. They declared a fast and all of them, from the greatest to the least, put on sackcloth. When the news reached the king of Nineveh, he rose from his throne, took off his royal robes, covered himself with sackcloth and sat down in the dust. Then he issued a proclamation in Nineveh: "By decree of the king and his nobles: Do not let any man or beast, herd or flock, taste anything; do not let them eat or drink. But let man and beast be covered with sackcloth. Let everyone call urgently on God. Let them give up their evil ways and their violence. Who knows? God may yet relent and with compassion and did not turn from his fierce anger so that we will not perish." When God saw that what they did and how they turned from their evil ways, he had compassion and did not bring upon them the destruction he had threatened." – Jonah 3:4-10*

Jonah was ANGRY, DISGUSTED and DISPLEASED.

*"But Jonah was greatly displeased and became angry." – Jonah 4:1*

*"He prayed to the LORD, "O LORD, is this not what I said when I was still at home? That is why I was so quick to flee to Tarshish. I knew that you are a gracious and compassionate God, slow to anger and abounding in love, a God who relents from sending calamity. Now, O LORD, take away my life, for it is better for me to die than to live." - vs. 2-3*

...RESENTMENT not dealt with, creates a house of UNFORGIVENESS and BITTNERNESS.

We all have to FORGIVE.

*"For if you forgive other people when they sin against you, your heavenly Father will also forgive you." Talk about the great contradiction, "But if you do not forgive others their sins, your Father will not forgive your sins." – Matthew 6:14-15*

*“But the LORD replied, “Have you any right to be angry?” Jonah went out and sat down at a place east of the city. There he made himself a shelter, sat in its shade and waited to see what would happen to the city.” – Jonah 4-5*

God is a GOD of COMPASSION

*“Then the LORD God provided a vine and made it grow up over Jonah to give shade for his head to ease his discomfort, and Jonah was very happy about the vine. But at dawn the next day God provided a worm, which chewed the vine so that it withered. When the sun rose, God provided a scorching east wind, and the sun blazed on Jonah's head so that he grew faint. He wanted to die, and said, “It would be better for me to die than to live.” - Jonah 4:6-8*

Jonah is not CONTENT

*“But God said to Jonah, “Do you have a right to be angry about the vine?” “I do,” he said. “I am angry enough to die.” - Jonah 4:9*

Jonah would rather DIE than ADMIT he was WRONG

Jonah thinks that LIFE is all about JONAH

*“But the LORD said, “You have been concerned about this vine, though you did not tend it or make it grow. It sprang up overnight and died overnight. But Nineveh has more than a hundred and twenty thousand people who cannot tell their right hand from their left, and many cattle as well. Should I not be concerned about that great city?” - Jonah 4:10-11*

Who are the Ninevites in our lives?

BIG QUESTION: Do we love the people of Nineveh?

Deeper Thoughts & Life Application

1. Jonah was living in the great contradiction. He knew God intimately, desired his forgiveness but withheld forgiveness from the Ninevites. Who is God asking you to forgive?
2. As we see in the life of Jonah, God is the great provider. He provided a storm, fish, vine, worm and the wind. What in your life

has been a direct provision from God? What was the purpose of his provision?

3. Is life all about you?
4. What have you done this week to reach out to your community, neighbors, hungry and the poor?
